NY Waterway and Boxcar Launch New Manhattan Service for New Jersey Commuters, Beginning May 2

Combined Ticket will Provide Seamless Weekday Shuttle and Ferry Travel Between Morristown, Madison, Chatham and NYC

Weehawken, NJ (April 29, 2025) -- NY Waterway, which operates the largest ferry fleet between New Jersey and New York, and integrated commuting company Boxcar today announced a new partnership that will offer Morris County commuters seamless, single-ticket shuttle and ferry travel into and out of Manhattan each weekday.

Beginning Friday, May 2, commuters can access a special shuttle from four Boxcar pickup locations in Morris County that will take them to the NY Waterway Liberty Harbor and Paulus Hook Ferry Terminals in Jersey City, where they can directly access ferries to both Brookfield Place, Pier 11/Wall Street and Midtown/W. 39th Street in Manhattan.

The special Boxcar/NY Waterway shuttles will make two trips each way, Monday through Friday, in the mornings and evenings from the following locations:

"Since Boxcar launched our first bus in 2017, we've heard from hundreds of commuters who work in Jersey City or downtown Manhattan who want an easier commute," said Boxcar CEO Joe Colangelo. "This new route and partnership with NY Waterway will get the ball rolling, and as we see more commuters improving their commutes with us, we're ready to rapidly add additional times for these towns and expand this route to the other towns that we serve today."

Tickets

Special combined tickets for the Boxcar shuttle and NY Waterway will be available for sale exclusively on the Boxcar app (Download for iOS or Android).

The combined fare is \$29.99 for one-way ferry and bus travel or \$22.57 for Boxcar members. Travelers headed to Jersey City without a ferry connection can pay as low as \$15.07 for bus service, with a Boxcar membership.

Founded by Arthur Imperatore, Sr. in 1986, NY Waterway operates the nation's largest privately-owned commuter ferry service. Prior to the pandemic shutdown, NY Waterway carried more than 32,000 passengers each weekday on 23 routes across the Hudson River, bringing New Jersey commuters to Manhattan and back. In cooperation with MTA Metro North Railroad, ferries bring commuters from the west side of the Hudson River in Newburgh and Haverstraw to the Hudson Line stations in Beacon and Ossining. On dozens of occasions, NY Waterway ferries have provided emergency service when public transit systems are disrupted. On 9/11, NY Waterway ferries evacuated more than 150,000 people from Manhattan, part of the largest maritime evacuation in history. In August 2003, when a massive blackout shut down all Hudson River crossings, NY Waterway carried 160,000 people home to New Jersey. Ferry crews have also rescued more than 300 people from New York waters, most notably the 143 people rescued from US Airways Flight 1549, the Miracle on the Hudson in 2009, the most successful marine rescue in aviation history.
